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Statement of Board Responsibilities

Waterford & Wexford Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Section 51 of that Act requires the ETB to keep in such form and in respect of such accounting periods as may be approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, all proper and usual accounts of the monies received or expended by it.

The Board is also responsible for safeguarding its assets and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement on Internal Control

The Waterford and Wexford Education and Training Board (WWETB) came into being on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education & Training Boards Act 2013. On that date WWETB took over the functions of the former County Wexford, County Waterford and City of Waterford VECs. With effect from 1st July 2014, WWETB took over, from SOLAS, the assets, liabilities and the management of the activities of Waterford and Wexford Training Centres.

The Code of Governance for ETB's is set out in Circular Letter 18/2015, which was issued by the Department of Education and Skills to all ETBs on 16th March 2015. The Code of Governance was adopted by WWETB at its meeting of 14th April 2015. Prior to this, the Board operated under the provisions of Circular Letter F11/2005. WWETB at its meeting held on 14th April 2015, completed the process of appointing its Finance and Audit Committees. The Audit committee held four meetings during 2017.

Responsibility for the System of Internal Control

As Chairperson of Waterford and Wexford Education and Training Board, I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board for ensuring that an efficient, effective system of internal control is maintained and operated. The system can only provide reasonable and not absolute assurance that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period.

Key Control Procedures

- Clearly identifying management and staff responsibilities;
- Establishing procedures for reporting significant control failures and ensuring appropriate corrective action;
- Establishing a formal risk management system involving procedures for identifying and evaluating all risks which could prevent the ETB achieving its objectives. The system has been tailored to the needs of WWETB by our insurers, IPB Ltd. who assisted in the establishment and implementation of this system. Risks identified have been coded with a priority strength code and dealt with as appropriate. Review of Risk Register is an Agenda item for all Senior Management Team Meetings.

The system of internal control operated in WWETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures
- Segregation of duties
- Specific authorisations
- Internal checks
- Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by WWETB.

The Board's monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control is informed by the:

- recommendations made by the Comptroller and Auditor General in management letters or other reports
- work of the Audit Committee which considers internal audit reports and reports of the C&AG and reports to the Board whether the Chief Executive is, in the internal auditor's opinion, operating adequate and appropriate systems of internal control
- Chief Executive who has responsibility for the control framework.

An internal audit service is provided by the Internal Audit Unit – Education and Training Boards. The most recent internal audits were conducted in 2016 and covered the areas of Adult Literacy and Teacher Allocation and Cooperation Hours. The Opinion Reports issued by Internal Audit were reviewed by the committee in 2017 and noted that WWETB has an adequate system of inter controls in place pertaining to the audits conducted. Internal audits were conducted in 2017 in respect of Training Centre Procurement and Information Technology.

Annual Review of Controls

WWETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. A formal review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control in respect of 2017 was carried out by Management on 26th February 2018 and presented to the Audit Committee in March 2018.

The Audit Committee received a report on the assessment of internal controls for 2017. Therein, WWETB management has certified that all internal controls either have been implemented or are in the process of implementation. The Audit Committee is satisfied with the internal controls that are in place, and is satisfied that WWETB will continue to monitor the internal controls and improve processes where necessary through a tracking system.

WWETB is committed to maximising value for money in all goods and services procured and ensuring compliance with all national and EU regulations. WWETB also utilises OGP frameworks where suitable for its needs. Procurement practices are being reviewed, in line with national procurement policy, to ensure best outcomes for aggregation. To this end, spend above €25,000 was analysed for 2017 and the following was noted:

- Schools and Further Education Centres Goods and services to the value of circa €958,000, acquired in 2017, were
 procured locally at school and centre level in accordance with WWETB procurement policy but the aggregate value
 across all sites exceeded the tendering threshold. This represents approximately 2% of WWETB non-pay expenditure in
 2017.
- Training Centres Goods and services to the value of circa €2.043m, acquired in 2017, were procured in accordance with terms of the Interim Business Continuity Arrangement (July 2014) adopted by the WWETB Board and the Training Centre Procurement Manual used by SOLAS training centres. These procedures remain in place pending the adoption of the ETB Procurement Policy developed by the ETB Procurement Network and approved by ETB Chief Executives Forum on 24th January 2018.

Significant efforts are being made to improve compliance on an ETB wide basis. The following solutions have been identified:

- A restructuring of WWETB's administrative functions took place in 2017 and as a result of this a senior appointment has been made in late Q2 2017 to lead a dedicated procurement team to (i) manage new tenders, (ii) review compliance and (iii) manage contracts.
- WWETB has highlighted the need for additional staffing in procurement in the recent Department of Education and Skills information gathering for Phase II of Organisation Design Review for ETBs in 2017 to undertake the key functions of the procurement team.
- The recently created procurement team are undertaking a spend analysis to identify categories of spend (Category Management) to ensure that the appropriate tendering process for competitions is held on an ETB wide basis.
- The ETB National Procurement Policy is to be reviewed by the Senior Management Team and prepared for adoption by the WWETB Board which will supersede all previous policies and procedures.
- The procurement team have identified a project schedule highlighting key competitions to be undertaken in 2018 which will deliver the benefits of aggregation in respect of goods and services acquired across WWETB.

The statement on internal control was reviewed and approved by the Board of Waterford and Wexford Education and Training Board at its meeting on 27/03/2018.

Opinion on financial statements

In my opinion,

- the financial statements properly present the income and expenditure of the Board for 2017 and the state of affairs of the Board at 31 December 2017; and
- the financial statements are in accordance with the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education and Skills.

Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit of the financial statements in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISAs) as promulgated by the International Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions. My responsibilities under those standards are described in the appendix to this report. I am independent of Waterford and Wexford Education and Training Board and have fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the standards.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Report on information other than the financial statements, and on other matters

The Board has presented certain other information together with the financial statements. This comprises the statement of Board responsibilities and the statement on internal control. My responsibilities to report in relation to such information, and on certain other matters upon which I report by exception, are described in the appendix to this report.

Non compliance with procurement rules

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with the ISAs, I exercise professional judgment and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. In doing so,

- I identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of
 the financial statements whether due to fraud or error;
 design and perform audit procedures responsive to those
 risks; and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and
 appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of
 not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud
 is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may
 involve collusion, forgery, Intentional omissions,
 misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- I obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the internal controls.

Reporting on other matters

My audit is conducted by reference to the special considerations which attach to State bodies in relation to their management and operation. I report if there are material matters relating to the manner in which public business has been conducted.

I seek to obtain evidence about the regularity of financial transactions in the course of audit. I report if there is any material instance where public money has not been applied for the purposes intended or where transactions did not conform to the authorities governing them.

I also report by exception if, in my opinion,

- I have not received all the information and explanations I required for my audit, or
- the accounting records were not sufficient to permit the financial statements to be readily and properly audited, or
- the financial statements are not in agreement with the accounting records.

(b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Statement presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus / (Deficit) is adjusted for other debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accrual basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related actual expenditure incurred and in Third Party Debtors are included in Current Assets. Pay and Expense Liabilities are included in Current

(c) Tangible fixed assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are expensed in the year of purchase. State grants to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are recognised in the same

All consumable stocks are expensed when purchased.

(e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS, are conferred under Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of the schemes are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding, or paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.
