080518.04 FINANCE

Finance Summary Report: Waterford and Wexford ETB Financial Situation at the end of March 2018: *Summary of Receipts and Payment* balances was circulated to the Board and noted. The Finance Officer outlined report to the Board highlighting the following:

- SOLAS Funding: The implication of timely release of funding from SOLAS was explained with the next tranche of funding awaited; funding provision continues to be closely monitored and the importance of timely issue of funding to WWETB was stressed.
- Overdraft: It is intended to extend WWETB's Overdraft Facility to the 31 December 2019 and the Finance Officer intends seeking sanction from the Board at the next meeting in accordance with the relevant regulations.
- Payroll and Finance Functions Shared Services ETB Project: the transfer of two ETBs to Payroll Shared Services has been delayed until later in 2018 as negotiations continue.
- Purchase to Pay: The new Purchase to Pay (P2P) system an invoice coding and payment mechanism has commenced and the Finance Department were acknowledged for roll-out of the new system.

The following correspondence was brought to the attention of the Board:

- (a) Nomination of Directors to the Board of Waterford Sports Partnership Ltd.: the current representative **Mr. Mark Fitzgerald** was nominated and approved: Proposed Mr. John Wall, Seconded Cllr. Lola O'Sullivan.
- (b) Notification for information from Irish Public Bodies Insurance of Annual General Meeting 27th April 2018 issued to Nominee appointed. **Cllr. Tom Cronin** current WWETB Nominee to attend.
- (c) Trusteeships Blackwater Community School, Lismore, Co. Waterford: correspondence from the Sisters of Mercy Provincial Office, Cork and Presentation Provincialate Presentation North East Province. The CE outlined correspondence which states that the Mercy and Presentation Sisters have asked CEIST to carry out the Trustee Function in its Community Schools where they are co-trustees.
- (d) Schools Reconfiguration for Diversity Process the CE outlined details of correspondence from the Minister for Education and Skills relating to the Process which aims to offer greater school choice for parents in line with the Programme for Government commitment to increase the number of multi-denominational and non-denominational schools to 400 by 2030 and to previous consultations with the Education and Training Boards sector in this regard.

Initial parental surveys are being conducted as part of the pilot phase in each ETB and WWETB has identified the Waterford City area. Census data received from the Department of Education and Skills (DES) assisted in making this recommendation. DES has asked that this data be confidential until further notice. The CE clarified various matters raised by members. The process 'Identification Phase' will involve surveys being conducted with preschool parents with the assistance of the Waterford County Childcare Committees by early June.

- (a) Audit and Finance Committees: No updates as no committee meetings held since last Board meeting.
- (b) Strategy Statement 2018-2022 (Section 27(6) of Education and Training Boards Act 2013): The WWETB Draft Strategy Statement was circulated to the Board for review and the CE thanked the Temporary Director of OSD, Mr. Paul Glynn, for his work in co-ordinating the document and invited him to outline the latest Draft Statement of Strategy to the Board. The document circulated contained the basic text of the Strategy Statement with some added sections. Extensive consultation and engagement has already taken place over a period of time with various stakeholder groups. In response to a query on timelines and implementation from Mr. John Wall, the CE confirmed a commitment to the achievement and delivery of the goals over the lifetime of the Strategy. Relevant appendices, data and graphics will now be added to the document in preparation for publishing, subject to the approval of the Board. Following discussion, the Board adopted the Strategy Statement as presented: Proposed: Cllr. Barbara-Anne Murphy, Seconded Cllr. Fionntán Ó'Súilleabháin.

080518.07 CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

The CE's Report was circulated to the Board for information and the Directors and Managers in attendance presented their respective reports and responded to matters raised. Some of the items highlighted included:

Strategic Development and Integration Process:

Retirement: Notification of retirement received from Ms. Suzanne Barrett, Principal of Kennedy College.

Appointments: Mr. Paul Glynn, Temporary Director OSD; Mr. Declan O'Toole, Temporary Principal Creagh College and consequential vacancies have been filled.

Maternity Leave: Temporary vacancy has been advertised to cover maternity leave for Ms. Gráinne Walsh, Principal, St. Declan's Community College.

Youth Officer: two Posts have been advertised.

SOLAS Strategic Planning workshops: a follow up to SOLAS and FET Planning Approach Meeting will be held at the end of May to conclude the process.

Education

Teaching and Learning: Mr. Mike Hughes, Facilitator of Teaching and Learning CPD is editing the Irish version of the "Magenta Principles", and will include WWETB as a Case Study of best practice in his book.

Section S29s Appeals Boards: The following personnel (retired WWETB Principals) were added as potential Representatives of the WWETB Board for Section 29 Panels: Mr. Eugene Power, Mr. Seamus Murphy and Mr. Senan Lillis; Proposed: Cllr. Mary Roche, Seconded Mr. John Wall. The members agreed that in the first instance current Board members should be contacted and if availability does not permit then the additional Personnel may be contacted.

School Accommodation: Cllr. Lola O'Sullivan expressed concern regarding school accommodation at a number of localities in the Waterford area despite vacant school buildings in the Tramore area. The CE advised that the Department of Education and Skills were made aware, at a meeting with the Building and Planning Unit last year, of the need for a new school in Tramore and a new application for a large scale extension at St. Declan's Community College has been submitted. A meeting has been sought with the Department of Education and Skills to discuss the urgent issues now arising in respect of accommodation including in particular St. Declan's Community College where a number of applicants for places in 1st year have been refused because of lack of accommodation. A discussion took place around the need for universal enrolment procedures for all schools and the

CE assured the Board that a review of these procedures was presently taking place.

Organisational Support and Development:

Recruitment: Correspondence from HR - Recruitment Section was distributed to the Board which sought to establish Board Members availability over the coming months in order to facilitate the creation of Interview Boards.

Further Education and Training:

ESF Returns: a significant amount of data is required to be collated and forwarded and details were outlined by the Director of FET. Challenging targets being set by SOLAS and DES were discussed and the Director of FET gave details. He added that the Draft FET Section of WWETB Service Plan will be presented at Area Committee level for review in due course.

Cllr. Ger Carthy referred to national estimates and targets and the development of new courses. A discussion took place during which the Director of FET advised that a considerable amount of analysis has already taken place including the completion of a Pilot Study and he thanked the Innovation and Development Manager in this regard.

The Director of FET gave an overview and responded to queries. He noted that the national targets have been set without consultation with ETBs; however more accurate figures and data will develop over the next few years. He also noted that traditional/current courses may not continue to be suitable due to changing learner and economic needs and there is also an increased demand for more part time courses.

Innovation and Development

The Innovation and Development Manager referred to the data and statistics gathering process which informs the development of courses with a view to responding to the training needs of an area and outlined examples of courses to assist in the development of employment. The importance of Progression Agreements, for example with both Waterford and Carlow Institutes of Technology was highlighted.

NZEB: WWETB continues to be at the forefront in the development of NZEB and are working in collaboration with Wexford County Council. An update on Trades and Draft National Skills Specification was outlined and it is expected to develop syllabi in Quarter 3 this year.

Enniscorthy is one of three locations including New York and Vancouver, identified worldwide as Centres of Excellence for the provision of nearly zero energy building standards.

A conference is scheduled to take place in New York at the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe in the near future - UNECE.

FAB Lab, Enniscorthy: The establishment of 'Fab Lab' is progressing. Product Design equipment available include 3D Printers plus Liquid 3D, Laser Cutters and CNC machines.

Youthwork

Notice of the 2018 Local Youth Club Grant Scheme has been advertised locally and forwarded to clubs and youth groups. Notification has also been received of a new Youth Capital Funding Scheme. A brief update was provided on progress with the appointment of Youth Officers.

Cllr. Barbara-Anne Murphy welcomed developments but expressed concern regarding retention rates of particular cohorts of students and the necessity for future planning giving specific examples from a local area. The CE referred to particular Pilot Initiatives and the identification of WWETB as an area of need for 'Special Intervention' for early school leavers. It was suggested that a discussion on Youthreach and Community Training Centres should be an agenda item taken at a future Board meeting.
