VITA HUB COMMUNITY GROUP

Vita Community Hub have been very busy over the summer. They participated in Community Education programmes funded through REACH. The group participated in Educatering with facilitator Pat Schaill and the Community Music Group with facilitator Ronald Barrios. The Educatering programme is a fabulous learning experience where the facilitator sits down with the group and they set out what they would like to cook over the programme. Every week they discover the joy of cooking their favourite dishes. Outside of the class the learners must make the dish that they have learned in class at home and send in a picture. At the end of the programme the learners receive certificates from Educatering in recognition of their achievements. The programme is designed to promote independence in the learners and be a steppingstone towards independent living.



The Vita Hub group made some noise and a lot of it with the Community music group. Every week they would join Ronald in a drumming circle where they would build on their fine motor and rhythm skills on a number of different types of drums using drumsticks or their bare hands. They would get the opportunity to create new and different beats slowly building up a sweat and a crescendo of beautiful noise.
