What is the Back to Education Initiative (BTEI)?



This programme offers certified, part-time courses at QQI Levels 4-6. It is aimed primarily at those who are unemployed, have not completed a leaving certificate or someone who is looking to learn a new skill or build on existing skills. Courses are also available to those in employment through Skills to Advance. Programmes can be undertaken as individual modules or as part of an overall major award and normally commence in September and January.

Courses are subject to change and may include the following:

- Healthcare Support 5M4339 (individual modules available)
- Bookkeeping / Payroll / Taxation
- Pathways (General Learning L4 major award)
- Special Needs Assisting QQI L5 & L6
- Office Administration
- Spreadsheets / Word Processing

What is Adult Literacy?



These courses are available for those who need support with their literacy and digital skills, to improve their opportunities and quality of life. What is an Apprenticeship course?



An apprenticeship combines learning in an education and training institution with work-based learning in a company. At least 50% of apprenticeship learning is completed in the workplace. Apprenticeships lead to nationally recognised qualifications.

Apprentices 'earn while they learn' – they have an employment contract and are paid a salary for the duration of their apprenticeship training.

Apprenticeships vary in length depending on the programme, lasting between two and four years.

What is VTOS?



People who are in receipt of a social welfare payment for at least 6 months and are over 21 can apply to do a VTOS course. All VTOS courses are fully funded and learners keep their social welfare payment rates, meal and travel allowances, supplemented childcare and can work without their payment being affected.

Courses include:

- General Learning through English as a second Language
- Office Skills
- Business Administration
- Community Health Service-Sports Massage
- Sport, Recreation and Exercise-Personal Training
- Business- Management
